Preparing to return

As part of planning for the return in this term, we have revisited and updated our risk assessments. By doing this, we have adopted measures to address the risks identified in our assessment, while still allowing us to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum for all our pupils.

The preventative measures that are in place are:

- 1) To minimise contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, **do not** attend school. If a child develops a suspected case while at school, they will remain in the isolation room until collected by a relative.
- 2) All children will be constantly reminded to clean hands thoroughly, more often than usual. This is supported by posters in every classroom and around the school. Each classroom has a 'hand sanitising station' with additional sanitiser, wipes and paper towels.
- 3) All classrooms have 2 bins, 1 lidded bin to ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.
- 4) A programme of regular enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents. All key areas in school have surface sanitising wipes so that regular wiping of door handles etc. can take place.
- 5) In order to minimise contact between individuals and maintain social distancing wherever possible, we will stick to corridor bubbles. Each bubble has extended start and staggered end times to the day, with staggered break and lunchtimes too.
- 6) Where needed and appropriate, personal protective equipment (PPE) is readily available in each corridor.

In response to any infection:

- 7) We will engage with the NHS Test and Trace process
- 8) We will manage confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) amongst the school community
- 9) We will contain any outbreak by following local health protection team advice

School starting and finishing times.

To minimise the number of people passing through the school gates at any one time we have set up an extended start and a staggered finish to the school day. We are asking that all children in Years 4, 5 & 6 leave their adult at the school gate and walk into school independently at the start of the day. Our 'soft start' to the day will continue, where children will enter their classrooms as soon as they arrive, there will be no lining up on the playground. This will also apply at the end of the day, where all children in Years 5 & 6 will meet their adult at the gate at the end of the day. Year 4 children will now be met by their adult at the door to Year 4 at the end of the day. This is to prevent a large crowd at the school gates waiting for children.

Children in Early Years, Y1, 2 & 3 need to be accompanied by a family member, but please only **ONE** person per family. This is to minimise the number of people on the school site. The soft start will also apply to these year groups. At the end of the day, children are to be collected from their classroom, **ONE** person per family please. Please see table of start and end times on the next page.

Please note, the school gates will not open until 8:30am. Please do not arrive at school before then. These measures are in place to try to keep the entrance into school as safe and practical as possible.

School Uniform

All children are expected to return in full school uniform. Reminders of this are at the end of the Flyer. Rather than the children bringing in their PE kit and changing at school, we are asking children to wear their kit to school on the day that thy have PE. PE days remain the similar to last term. Please could children bring essential items only to school. This could include their school bag / book bag, lunchbox and water bottle. No toys or additional items (pencil cases etc) to come into school. All the children have a pencil case with a set of resources that they need.

Remote Learning Parent Survey (Seesaw & Tapestry)

Thank you to all the parents who completed our recent survey about the remote learning that was offered during the last 8 weeks. We were very pleased with the feedback. 74% of parents completing the survey felt that the work their child had been given was about right with 88% of parents reporting that the support their child was receiving from their teacher was good or excellent. A huge 97% of parents felt that the school had provided them with enough information to support their child with their learning. 41% of parents felt that their child was learning about the same with 50% of parents feeling that their child was learning slightly less. We are aware that some children will have been anxious and feeling stressed at times during this period, and this showed with a 25% result. Please speak to either your class teacher or Mrs Manders if you feel this continues when your child returns to school.
