Breakfast club

Our breakfast club runs from 7.30am each day. Children are fully supervised and have a choice of cereals, toast and a drink of water, juice or milk. After breakfast, they can take part in a variety of games and activities before the start of the school day.

Uniform

We believe that it is important for children to come to school in uniform and to look smart, and we ask for parents to support us in this matter. Our uniform consists of:

- · Red sweatshirt or cardigan.
- · Black or grey trousers or skirt.
- · White polo shirt.
- Black shoes.
- Year 6 pupils also wear a tie.

Food in school

The lunch provided in our school consists of a hot two-course meal, offering a choice of main courses, vegetables, salads and desserts. A cold lunchbox option is also available. The menu for the week to come is displayed in the noticeboard as you come into school. The menus are designed to be tempting and healthy and offer choice for vegetarians with some special diets available.

Free school meals

Whilst all children in Reception Class, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to receive a free school meal under the Universal Free School Meal entitlement, parents/carers are strongly encouraged to also complete a free school meal application form as each child eligible for a Free School Meal based upon parent/carer income attracts a "Pupil Premium" for the school which is provided by Central Government and equates to a cash amount for your child's School. This is then used to support children's education through the provision of additional teachers, Learning Support Assistants and resources.

CREATIVE CURRICULUM: A FIRM FOUNDATION FOR LEARNING

Our curriculum is more than the timetabling of lessons. It is embedded in the day-to-day life of our school, from assemblies to play time, educational visits to school productions. We aim for our curriculum to be vibrant and exciting, bringing learning to life through a real context.

Priority on progress

We strive to be the very best we can be for our children and the community of which we are part. While we will always prioritise our children's academic outcomes and progress, we believe that we offer more than just academic focus. We want our children to be ready for all of life's challenges and to be able to grasp every opportunity that comes their way; we believe that this can only come about by enabling a curriculum that focuses on building a range of key skills as well as deep knowledge and personal development. Our curriculum is shaped by four key:

Safety first

We believe that we need to weave each of the four through every minute of every day if we are to meet our vision and ensure that all of our children are ready for the next stage in their development when they leave Beccles Primary Academy. The biggest part of our curriculum is focused on the core academic elements of learning through our delivery of the National Curriculum. In addition, our 'We are prepared' framework provides opportunities to develop and apply knowledge and skills outside the National Curriculum.

Music

Our Music provision includes specialised teaching for the curriculum as well as opportunities to partake in singing lessons as well as Rocksteady Music School, which gives children the chance to try out a range of instruments and find out which suits them best.

Sport and P.E.

Our P.E. is provided by a specialised instructor. We team up with local schools for tournaments (football, rounders etc) and with our REAch2 Local cluster of schools for sporting events such as Olympics & Paralympics Festivals. We offer a wide range of extra-curricular sports clubs including basketball, gymnastics, athletics, dodgeball and football.
