### **What you will need at home**

For children to learn effectively at home you may find the following advice helpful:

- As the lessons and resources are available online, children will need a device that can access the internet, such as a laptop, desktop computer or tablet. If you need support with devices or accessing the internet, please contact the school office.
- For some activities, children will need paper, pens or pencils to record their answers. We can supply these resources to you – please let us know if you need them.
- Consider your children's home learning environment. Have they got a quiet space where they can work without interruption?

### **What we expect from your child**

It is important that your child engages with home learning and completes the tasks that have been set. These are outlined in the document – ***Remote Education: Information for Parents***

If they are not engaging with the learning, we will make an initial phone call home to discuss how we could provide additional support if needed.

## What you can do to help

We appreciate that this does present some challenges for you. We kindly ask for your support so that we can continue to provide high-quality education for your child during this time.

Younger children, in particular, may need support in accessing online materials and staying focused with their remote learning. We ask that you help them as much as you can.

At the same time, we do not expect you to watch your child all day, and we would not expect parents/carers to get involved in remote lessons in place of our teachers. But it would be really helpful if you can take an active role in your child's learning by asking them about their day and what they have learned.

Our top tips:

- Try to encourage your child to be ready and dressed for the start of the school day, and to keep to their timetable.
- Distinguish between weekdays and weekends and make it clear when the school day is over, to separate home and school life.
- Plan breaks and exercise into the day to help keep your child active.

Please keep in touch with us and do let us know if you are having any difficulties with remote learning, or if you have any questions. Please leave a message with the school office and a member of staff will contact you back.
